President's Message

Abraham Lincoln, Signature Strengths... and the way forward.

t the start of my Presidential year, I made a commitment to advance our organization and its mission with a focus on the Service Component of Access to Care (A2C); namely my role and that of this organization, how we define service, who we believe we should serve, and why I think it matters.

In describing the "way forward" the backdrop I have chosen comes from a well-written article entitled "Lincoln's School of Management-Resilience and Careful Listening, as learned in 1862" (NY Times, Jan. 27, 2013, Sunday Business section). Lincoln's presidency, some might suggest, was a study in "high-caliber

leadership". The most poignant excerpt reads, "...the lessons of Lincoln seem as fresh as ever. They demonstrate the importance of resilience, forbearance, emotional intelligence, thoughtful listening and the consideration of all sides of an argument. They also show the value of staying true to a larger mission." The article went on to say, "Lincoln...always looked upward and always called American citizens to a higher road and to a purpose bigger than themselves".

Certainly what we offer our membership in the way of advocacy, peer review, quality continuing education, and representation at the component, state, and national levels is impressive. I will submit that the one enterprise that will continue to engage our membership, develop our leadership, attract new members, and sustain this organization for years to come is our main signature strength-our commitment to help those in need.

We have spelled out a commitment to Access to Care. We have reached out to the membership to encourage volunteerism. We have honored those that stood out amongst the best and brightest in talent, passion, and leadership skills. Now we have called for formal strategic planning at the West Coast level while encouraging similar exercises at the affiliate level. - A sense of yearning to find new ways to use it
- A feeling of inevitability in using the strength ("Try to stop me")
- Invigoration rather than exhaustion while using the strength
- The creation and pursuit of personal projects that revolve around it
- Joy, zest, enthusiasm...while using it

We will use these tools and others to engage in this Strategic Planning process starting in a full day session in early May and extending to our yearly Officer Planning Session at the summer meeting in Naples. To that end we are also interested in engaging our affiliate leadership in collaborative and meaningful ways to maximize our effectiveness as an organization.

A second signature strength that the WCDDA has long enjoyed is strong leadership. The Don Cadles, Nolan Allens, Betty Hughes of the world along with a whole litany of others have led by example to forge the path for the next generation of leaders. We want to be well poised to support the initiatives of our own Dr. Terry Buckenheimer during his upcoming tenure as President of the Florida Dental Association, 17th ADA District Trustee, and beyond. His concept of "attraction over promotion" will continue to be a common thread and guiding principle.



ADA Updating HIPAA Manual

Most covered entity dental practices will need to review and revise their HIPAA compliance policies, procedures and documents such as Notice of Privacy Practices and Business Associate Agreements to comply by September 23, 2013 with regulations that became effective March 26, 2013. For more information, view this link http://www.ada.org/news/8355.aspx. The ADA has updated and combined its HIPAA Privacy and Security Manuals. It includes up-to-date information on HIPAA Privacy and Security regulations, including HITECH Act requirements for encryption, breach notification, business associate agreements, disclosure and use of Protected Health Information, increased compliance enforcement by the Office for Civil Rights, and significantly higher fines for non-compliance. The kit includes new sample forms, sample policies and procedures, checklists, sample risk assessment questions, workforce training guidance and a three-year subscription to the annual HIPAA Compliance Update Service. 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The Last Word

I wrote the following for a membership update I gave to the March Hillsborough County Dental Association meeting. My apologies to those folks who actually paid attention AND read this editorial (that means you Reza). I cut the intro due to time constraints and in respect to the CE speaker. The intro portrayed what our future could be like if we didn't have our lobbyists (our intel and subsequent soldiers on the ground in Tallahassee) who have our backs concerning legislature affecting dentistry. Here it is followed by some significant facts about our membership crisis in Florida:

This could be your average day in the future. You wake up, cruise through your morning routine and head to the office. Notice I said "the" office and not "your" office. Chances are it won't be yours, but if you're one of the few owners left, realize it might only be because you have a fleet of employee dentists working for you to allow you to keep overhead from chewing up all profit. You check your schedule and

notice a "light" load of 40 patients. However, most of them are on the government dictated, government run insurance product. Crowns are \$500, fillings are \$50, but the good news is you won't be interrupted by those annoying (however highly productive) hygienists and exams, because due to a strong hygiene association patients can now get preventive treatment done by hygienists at the department of health in an expanded Medicare program. Fortunately, you see a small glimmer of production hope on the schedule, an Invisalign start...but ohth wait, the non-covered services bill did not pass and the patient's insurance plan dictates you can only charge \$2500. I guess that's good news because that will at least cover your lab bill and you are required by the plan to perform the treatment. Eventually the only dentistry you look forward to is the volunteering you are doing on the weekend, but even that comes with a price because you can't charge the patient even a nominal lab fee because of inconsistent sovereign immunity rules.

The interesting thing about this scenario is the fact that the majority of the issues above are (as I write this) being hashed out in House and Senate committees and on their respective floors. So how do you prevent this from happening? Pay your dues and convince your colleagues to do the same. We have decent membership numbers if you look at all membership associations, but if you look at our downward trend it is disconcerting. It WILL eventually hurt our lobbyists and dramatically affect the Advocacy they fight for on our behalf. We have a 66% membership market share nationwide, down from 74% in 1993. But Florida is nowhere near this level; we have a 57% level that has dropped 10% in three short years. Two of the FDA components have market shares in the 40's with one at 43%. Large group practices, members finding a home in alternative dental organizations, and lack of perceived benefit/high cost of membership are three main factors that tax our membership staff and volunteers.

So, to make a long story short, we need every member to make an effort to recruit nonmembers. It used to be that nonmembers could rely on our members to do the dirty work, and our rank and file members could rely on leadership to recruit and retain membership. It won't be that easy going forward, but to create a little incentive the ADA has begun a "Member-Get-A-Member" Program. For every nonmember you recruit, you receive a \$100 gift card, up to a maximum of 5 in a calendar year. Do a simple Google search or go to http://www.ada.org/8185.aspx for more info. Your future and avoiding the nightmare depicted above depends on it.
