

#### Dr. Nicholas Grimaudo | 2 CEUs

This lecture will provide current and specific information for the proper detection, reporting, and investigation of human abuse. Participants will gain an understanding of the importance of the unique position of the oral healthcare team in recognizing abuse, and the responsibilities of the oral healthcare team as mandated reporters according to Florida law and the FDA and ADA Codes. Additionally, participants will:

- Study the various maxillofacial, oral, head, neck, and body injuries that are generally associated with human physical abuse, to include child, spousal, elder, and abuse of the disabled.
- Learn the various types of abuse that may present, including physical, emotional, sexual, and financial, as well as neglect.
- Understand the behaviors that are common among abuse victims and offenders and will learn how their examination can aid in a complete investigation.
- Gain an understanding of the psychological, patient management, and treatment considerations of both the abused patient and the abuse survivor.

## **OUR SPEAKERS**

**Dr. Nicholas J. Grimaudo** graduated in 1976 from Adelphi University with a bachelor's degree in biology and received his DMD in 1980 from the University of Florida (UF) College of Dentistry in Gainesville. Dr. Grimaudo spent 15 years in private practice before returning to academia. He received a master's degree in



material sciences & engineering in 1992 and a master's degree in oral microbiology in 1995, both from UF College of Medicine. Dr. Grimaudo has taught at UF College of Dentistry since 1989 and has served UF as director of quality assurance for its dental clinics, director for advanced techniques with esthetic restorations, and director of infection control in dentistry. In 2007, Dr. Grimaudo completed a doctoral degree in educational administration and policy at UF College of Education. In addition to teaching and developing coursework on treatment planning and clinical dentistry, Dr. Grimaudo teaches continuing education courses for healthcare professionals on administrative, regulatory and practice related issues. He is the owner of Compliance Training Associates and consults with medical and dental offices on OSHA and HIPAA issues. He has lectured nationally and internationally on risk management, domestic violence issues, record keeping and compliance, ethics and jurisprudence, preventing medical/dental errors, treatment planning/diagnosis and other practice-related topics.

**Dr. Bill Layman** is a graduate of The Citadel and proudly served our country in the US Army as an 82nd airborne paratrooper. He then earned his Dental Degree at the Medical University of South Carolina followed by an Ortho Residency at Vanderbilt University where he was elected by his faculty and peers as Chief Resident. More recently, Dr. Layman returned to the Wharton



School of Business at University of Pennsylvania where he earned his MBA, a very unique combination of personal academic achievements! Since 2005 Dr. Layman has been practicing at Straighten Up Ortho in Clearwater, FL — a single doctor, single location practice.





## WCDDA Members attend the FDA's Dentists Day on the Hill in Tallahassee



#### SPECIAL NOTE FROM DR. STEVE TINSWORTH:

### A Banner Year for Dentistry!

The FDA sent all members a Special Alert memo in early March that is important to you and your patients. It outlined key legislative actions from the 2024 Session (summarized in the sidebar at right). Organized dentistry — ADA, FDA, WCDDA, and our local dental societies — has always been looking at how to be professionally caring for oral health and its safe delivery to the public: our patients.

It just doesn't happen. It takes focus and effort in being attuned

to issues and to those who represent us in government and health organizations. It impacts the costs of running our practices.

Acknowledging organizations of dentistry who are serving the public's best interest is important as a profession. It is pride and respect for being leaders for our patients and public health.

This was a banner year for dentistry in the legislature. Contacting and sharing information with our elected officials and their staff is very important.

We have been blessed with having some very solid elected officials who trust our input and it was returned this year with wonderful legislative support for oral health in Florida.

Please share with your staff and patients how dentists supported these actions and how our legislators supported these measures. It's a great time to toot the horn for the work we do with the FDA to better care for the Florida public.

#### STATEMENT FROM DR. BEATRIZ TERRY, PRESIDENT OF THE FDA:

"The FDA thanks the Florida Legislature for their tremendous efforts to prioritize and promote oral health. Oral health has far-reaching impacts on the overall health and wellbeing of Floridians. By supporting solutions that safeguard patients and promote access to routine dental services and preventive care for all Floridians, we can make a lasting impact on people's lives, health and futures."



## 2024 Legislative Session Outcomes:

It was year in which dental advocates worked for funding for programs to increase access to dental care for Florida's veterans and underserved populations, and the passage of legislation to protect patients and promote oral health for all Floridians.

#### Key legislative actions included:

- Passage of bills in the Florida Senate and House to ensure Florida patients receive the dental benefits they are paying for and requires dental insurance plans to obtain consent from the dentist to pay a claim by a virtual credit card.
- Passage of the Live Healthy Act, which expands the dental student loan repayment program, training opportunities for dental students, and an increase for dental services in Florida's Medicaid program, which hasn't had a funding increase since 2011.
- Passage of bills in the Florida Senate and House to increase patient protections for direct-toconsumer dentistry.
- \$1 million in funding to implement Florida's veterans dental care grant program
- \$250,000 in funding for the 2025 Florida Mission of Mercy

## What's it like to attend Dentists' Day on the Hill for the first time?

This was very helpful as I was able to go to a few meetings with veterans of Dentists' Day on the Hill as they reviewed the bills up for consideration by the House and Senate this year.

Jumping from group to group, I was able to meet with our representatives (including one of my patients who welcomed me with open arms) and one legislative aide. By the early afternoon, I was comfortable enough to

provide my insight on some of the bills being considered.

One of the reasons I would recommend any of you consider going to Dentists' Day on the Hill in the future is to see how the representatives embrace having us visit and listening to our side of the issues. I was truly impressed by how knowledgeable the representatives and their aids were on many of the issues that affect us but also realized how important it was for us to educate them on the nuances that might not be as obvious to someone who does not sit at the chair every day.

I know it is a lot to ask, of many people, to take a day or two off of work in an effort to be the face of dentistry to our representatives, however, I think you'll find that it's a small
